### Students need Junior Achievement more than ever.

More than half of teens across the U.S. say they feel unprepared to finance their futures, according to the 2022 <u>JA Teens & Personal Finance Survey</u>. The problem is amplified in our own backyard. Upward mobility is a critical issue facing Charlotte and North Carolina.

Yet, there's reason to be hopeful and celebrate the impact that the Central Carolinas community has had on the lives of students. During the 2021-22 school year, more than 22,400 students engaged in Junior Achievement programs, which is a strong recovery from the interruption caused by COVID. ## JA BizTown and JA Finance Park

After completing 17 in-classroom lessons, middle school students visit JACC TowneBank Opportunity HQ. Here, they apply what they've learned in a hands-on interactive simulation. Each program allows students to strengthen their skills in:

- Financial Literacy: Students are given life personas and challenged to build a budget and determine wants vs. needs in JA Finance Park®. From this, they see how their choices have daily and long-term impacts.
- Work Readiness: In both simulations, students have interactions with corporate volunteers who provide insight on potential career pathways.
- Entrepreneurship: Students learn for themselves what it takes to operate a business, taking on roles such as CEO, CFO, Marketing Manager and more in JA BizTown®.

### Classroom and Virtual Experiences

JACC delivers program offerings that align with the goals and needs of our community. In 2021-22. K-5 and 9-12 students in the Central Carolinas took part in several key learning opportunities:

- JA In A Day: Partnering with a local elementary school, youth leaders in our High School Heroes program teach basic financial literacy definitions and concepts to K-12 students.
- JA Personal Finance 2.0: High school students explore fundamental elements of personal finance and prepare to make informed financial decisions upon graduation. This curriculum supports districts implementing an Economic and Personal Finance course, now required for all NC graduating students.
- JA Inspire Virtual Career Fair: During a virtual career expo, students explore high-growth, high-demand industries, career and learning experiences offered by local employers, and continuing education opportunities.
